#### One bus a week, every week

20 people have a disability

7 are pensioners

6 have children under 5 with them

2 are refugees



Half need grants to afford energy or essentials

1 has no heat or hot water

2 are in problem fuel debt

3 can't talk to their supplier

4 ask for advice to meet bills

- Maximise Income- Benefits check, applying for grants, budgeting advice
- Minimise Heat Loss Retrofit and draught excluding
- Reduce Energy Consumption Behaviour change and energy saving measures



PEC Renewables provides a loan to Ernesettle Community Solar.


Surplus funds from Ernesettle


